Information provided by the donor: During my early years as a pastor, the Reverend Jim Searcy was a friend and mentor to me. While I served the Dyersburg CPC as associate minister of Christian education, he was a senior pastor and taught me much about pastoral ministry through his friendship and mentorship. I learned how to conduct my first funeral, how to perform weddings, how to document an account for clergy taxes, and even how to navigate church conflict. He included me in every aspect of pastoral ministry, constantly reminding me that I was one of the pastors of the church – not an associate, not a second string, not anything less than he was in his role. Every new pastor should have a mentor like Jim Searcy. He was a skilled craftsman. He built beautiful bookcases for his office at the denominational center when it was located on Union Avenue in Memphis, Tennessee. When the center was relocated to its new campus, those bookcases were carefully relocated as well. I now sit in that office surrounded by his beautiful handiwork as a team leader for the Pastoral Development Ministry Team, the predecessor of the Commission on the Ministry. So, his influence continues in my life and ministry today.
