Understanding Effective Consent



EFFECTIVE CONSENT IS:

- Informed
- Freely and voluntarily given
- Active, not passive
- Ongoing



NOT EFFECTIVE CONSENT:

- · Silence or the absence of "NO"
- · Lack of resistance (by itself)
- Underage or incapacitation
- Implied consent from past sexual activity

Mixing sex with drinking/drugs often leads to problems and confusion about whether there was effective consent!

FIRST STEPS

Seek medical care ASAP

Preserve physical evidence (separately in paper bags)

Screenshot social media evidence

Advantages of the Bethel University Title IX Process

Both parties have more options.

The following applies to most cases:

Complainants can choose to only receive supportive measures and not to file a formal complaint.

If Complainants want to file a formal complaint, they can choose between Informal Resolutions or Formal Resolutions.

Informal Resolutions utilizes a Facilitator who helps the parties reach a mutually-acceptable resolution, similar to mediation.

Formal Resolutions involves an investigation, live virtual hearing, and sanctions when there is a determination of responsibility.

In all cases, there is a presumption of non-responsibility.

SUPPORTIVE MEASURES

Supportive measures will be offered to both parties, as applicable, and can include, but are not limited to:

- · Referrals to Counseling
- No-Contact Directives
- Rescheduling of Exams/ Assignments
- Excused Absences
- Alternative Course Completion Options
- Changing Class and Work Schedules, Assignments, and Locations

- · Residence Hall Reassignments
- Escort Between Classes and Activities
- Academic Support Services, such as Tutoring
- · Training and Education Programs
